CORRECTLY HANDLING GOD'S WORD

"Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth." 2 Timothy 2:15 (NIV)

Just this week I was on Facebook and came across a meme that highlighted an Old Testament passage of Scripture from Deuteronomy 28:43. The verse reads: "Foreigners who live in your land will gain more and more power, while you gradually lose yours" (Good News Translation). Of course, the purpose of quoting this verse was to make a spiritual point about all the chaos going on at our southern border. On the surface it sounds good and it surely seems to add some spiritual weight to a political crisis facing our nation. However, the harsh reality is that the scripture that is quoted to spiritualize this political issue is blatantly taken out of context.

Like anything in God's Word----context matters! First, this verse is given as a warning and a curse to God's people for their continued disobedience towards God. In fact, Deuteronomy 28:45 tells us why this empowering of foreigners has happened, "because you did not serve the Lord your God with joy and gladness of heart." In other words, the foreigners in the land increased in power because God's people decreased in obeying and serving God. So, if we were to make a modern day application out of this verse we would be more correct in saying that the present cause of our "border chaos" is due to our nation's unfaithfulness to the Lord rather than trying to use God's Word to decry foreigners being in our lands. Secondly, the section of Scripture that was used to make this argument comes from the Old Testament Law, the law that God used to govern the nation of Israel. As Christians, we do not fall under the demands of these laws of governance. They were specific to the nation of Israel and God's chosen people.

Now I mention this example because it is one of many you can find on social media today and it highlights a growing danger found far too readily on the internet. Namely, that we as Christian's must be very, very careful when we start sharing Bible verses to make political points or use the Bible to sway opinions. Certainly, the Word of God is truth in all matters pertaining to life and issues of life. But truth taken out of context or scripture that is mishandled can lead believers and unbelievers to accept things that just aren't true. Our aim, as in all things, is to honor God. This holds especially true as it concerns God's Word. Just as Paul admonished young Timothy, our task is to "rightly divide the word of truth" (God's Word) so that we will not be "ashamed." Indeed, misquoting Scripture or using it out of context is not the path to honoring God. It's just another path that leads us to shame and regret. So take heed when you quote God's Word. The responsibility to do it "rightly"-----rests on YOU!
