A Race to Forty

In the G2 and F3 groups, we're currently running a "Race to Forty" challenge. Back in August, we challenged our youth to reach attendance of over 40 on three separate nights before December. The reward? A lock-in.

So, why did we create this challenge? Are we just chasing higher numbers? Not at all. It's not about the number—it's about training our youth to invite others to church. It's about encouraging them to reach beyond their usual circle. It's about reminding them to reconnect with those who haven't attended in a while. It's about giving them ownership of their group's growth.


As a youth director, my influence only goes so far. I can text, send cards, make phone calls, and set up group chats—but none of that has the same impact as a quick Snap or Insta from a fellow youth group member. Our volunteers can do all the things, but nothing beats peer influence. After all, this isn't my youth group. It's not even First Baptist of Batesburg's youth group. This is their youth group.

Our youth hold the power and influence over their friends and peer groups—whether positive or negative—in ways adults never could. Their actions determine the outcome. If they decide it's not important, they won't put in the effort. If it's a goal they truly want to achieve, they'll hit the mark.

So, what are they learning? They're learning to become the church. The youth who show up on Sunday evenings are our future. By setting goals and challenges that build habits and accountability, we're shaping future leaders. By encouraging them to take ownership of their group's health, we're preparing them to be good stewards of our congregation.

What if they don't hit the mark? Honestly, we haven't planned for that. Why? Because our leaders believe in them. So far, we've reached 43 on one night and 40 on another—we're still one night short. We've had multiple nights with 38 and 39 in attendance, and they're begging for those to count, asking us to bend the rules just a bit. But we're holding strong. We're putting our faith in them to succeed. We're proud of the effort our youth are putting into this challenge. It's more than a race—it's a reflection of their heart for community, their desire to grow, and their willingness to lead. Whether they reach 40 three times or not, they're already showing us what it means to be the church. Let's continue to pray for them, support them, and celebrate the journey they're on.


